

Pedestrian Master Plan - Timeline



- 2013: Steering Committee formed
- 2015: Statistically significant mail out survey
- 2015: Special outreach survey
- 2016: Public input meetings and survey
- 2016-2021: Numerous presentations and discussions
- February 10, 2022: Final document adopted by MPO

Pedestrian Master Plan - Objectives

Safety

- 1.1 Traffic accidents involving pedestrians are reduced
- 1.2 All major pedestrian crosswalks are safe and clearly marked
- 1.3 Areas around schools are safe + encourage walking
 1.4 Sidewalks are in safe walking condition
- 1.5 Adequate lighting along walkways1.6 Walking in the MPO area is regarded as safe
- 2. Connectivity
 - 2.1 Infrastructure exists to provide access to commercial districts

 - 2.2 Infrastructure exists to provide access to transportation modes
 2.3 Parks and cultural amenities have adequate connectivity.
 - 2.4 Gaps are filled in the existing sidewalk network

3. Wellness

- 3.1 A greater percentage of trips are made by foot
- 3.2 Childhood obesity is reduced
 3.3 Adult obesity is reduced
- 3.4 A lower percentage of adults are physically inactive
- 3.5 A greater percentage of people walk for wellness
- 3.6 The public is interested in creating a walkable community


4. Design

- 4.1 Sidewalks and other walking paths are accessible for all
- ages and abilities
 4.2 Pedestrian traffic is a strong consideration in street design

Pedestrian Master Plan – Policy Recommendations



- 1. Prioritize sidewalk construction and infill needs
- 2. Establish annual funding source for new sidewalks
- 3. Establish annual funding source for sidewalk maintenance
- 4. Restructure and expand MET Transit Service
- 5. Revise snow removal policies and enforcement

Pedestrian Master Plan – Planning Recommendations





- Encourage sidewalk connections in new development
- 2. Update zoning to prioritize street connectivity
- 3. Encourage transit-oriented development (TOD)
- 4. Reduce minimum parking requirements
- 5. Adopt pedestrian "through zones"
